

Householder Auction

Over the last 50 years, Tom Householder of Lancaster Ohio, gathered an amazing collection of British cars. Last month he sold it all.

Tom is one of the founding members of the Triumph Register of America and always had his fingers in some rather unique projects. Here are just a couple examples: He created the "TRuck". This was a TR3 that had the backend removed and replaced with a homemade truck bed. I don't know why someone would do this; but he did. Another effort was the "TRrock", a 12-inch TR3 model car that was cast in cement.

Tom sold his entire collection of Swallow Doretti's and Triumphs a few weeks ago. A Doretti glovebox Operators Manual in excellent condition sold for \$2500. One member of Delaware Valley Triumphs purchased a box of rusty TR2 and TR3 parts. He wasn't after the rusty parts on the top of the box; but wanted the two early TR2 thermostat housings he found in the bottom of the box.

There were nine Doretti's sold, with the most expensive selling for \$18,000. Someone looking for a project could have purchased a project Doretti minus an engine for \$2600. In my mind, a cheap price for such a rare car.



A 1970 TR6 with several pieces missing sold for \$700. A TVR went for \$3000 and a '66 TR4 race car with an extensive Mid-Ohio race history brought \$4000. An all original long door TR2 (TS2797LO) with 7,696 original miles sold for \$9000. Tom purchased this car from the Harrah's museum in Las Vegas many years ago. Unfortunately, it sat for years under a lean-to, defenseless against critters and elements. When sold, the car was covered with surface rust and the interior had numerous rips and tears.

The highlight of the auction was a 1955 Francorchamps TR2 (TS5595LN). For those unfamiliar with this model, they were TR2s made in Belgium with an attached hardtop, redesigned doors, and roll up windows.

Of those 22 Belgium- made cars, only 17 remain in existence today. Even with its missing parts, disassembled state and missing engine, it still brought \$33,000!

Saturday, February 25th was a cool and windy day to drive a Brit car to Denny Ryder's Tech session in Loganville, PA; but the inside of his garage was warm, with 19 attendees (8 from LANCO MG Club!). The hospitality and generosity of Denny and his wife, Tana, made the trip completely worthwhile. Denny mentioned that his background in Auto Body repair started in High School Vo-Tech and included several years of operating his own body shop. He then moved on to a long career in the insurance industry.

The cars of the 60's through the 80's were much different in structure and materials used compared to today's models. Three project cars were on display showing the different stages of the process. The black 1957 Corvette was outstanding, needing only finishing touches.



The Opel GT and TR250 formed the basis for the discussion.

Denny went through the various stages of the processes, materials and tools he uses based upon his years of experience. He showed us when welding is a useful option and also a 3M glue that performs just as well.



As he went through the discussion, one got the feeling that it's not rocket science, but it's the next thing to it!

Following the 2 1/2 hour presentation, subs and refreshments were served, along with lots of discussion. Many folks commented that it may be best to leave this job to the pros!
