## Import & Performance Show Carlisle, PA Fairgrounds May 12-13,2023 ~ By Denny Ward

On the morning of May 12th, I checked the oil, topped off the dashpots, cinched up the collar of a light coat and motored off to Carlisle PA for my pilgrimage to the Carlisle Import (and Performance) Show. The TR-4 felt really good cruising with the top down for the 45-minute drive to the Fairgrounds. I arrived around 9:15 AM, which gave me a little time to say hello to friends at our CPTC tent, get my goody bag and make a quick tour of the vendor area before my 10 AM shift at the tent started. Although not as populated as in the olden days, the vendor spaces were filled in pretty well. Other foreign cars were also pulling into the show field; but they would have to wait until my shift ended.

I arrived back at the tent and club Vice President Rory Liebrum had already sold two hats and taken dues from several members. He had things under control and all went smoothly. We sold a few more hats and other regalia, took a few more membership renewals and signed several new members as well. Of course, folks continued to arrive and chairs and conversation filled the tent. Having my duties done, I returned to the vendors area to see what treasures I could spot.

There were tons of used parts, British and others, books, tools and toys. The only parts I really needed were two little clips to fasten the 'T' onto the bonnet of my Triumph.

It had fallen off several days ago -I have a spare T; but it is embarrassing driving around in a 'RIUMPH.' (Some members will recall that at my first Import show, 30+ years ago, I was driving a 'TRUMH'). The only purchase I made, other than lunch on Friday, was a 1950s toy car.

The displays in the pavilions were really interesting. A black 1963 TR-4 was for sale. This car had a hill-climbing history almost from day one, attested to by the slew of dash plaques, and it seemed in decent shape for a race car.

The Rolls Royce Museum brought a dozen or so historic vehicles - just beautiful.



German cars graced another building, with a cool display of Audi Quattro Coupes and other neat machines. Very cool (odd?) was a 1958 DKW Schnellaster truck with a 2-stroke, 3 cylinder engine.


