

We left early Saturday morning, June 8th for Virginia. I had the TR3B in tow with our daughter and her family following us. I found it interesting that, while on the interstate, cars would come alongside and slow down to look and take pictures of the TR3. It is a white car with a red interior and wire wheels and the contrast is eye catching.

We arrived at Massanutten Resort later in the morning and checked into our rental units. They consist of semidetached houses with two bedrooms and a full kitchen.



That afternoon, we headed into Waynesboro for a car show, about 30 miles south of the resort.

The show had a lot of nice cars, including a stunning, green 1976 TR6 owned by members of the Shenandoah British Car Club. It was low mileage, very original and even had AC. After the show, we found an ice cream shop on the way back to the resort. I recorded 68 miles and the car ran flawlessly.

On Sunday, June 9th, we traveled to Mt Crawford, VA for another car show at a local winery. Again, members of the British Car Club were there. A nice old Rolls Royce was there and I was pleased that my Triumph drew about the same amount of attention. I recorded another 30 flawless miles.

On Monday, June 10th, we just drove around the locale, took some pictures and put another 30 miles on the car.

On Tuesday, June 11th I found time to play 18 holes of golf in the morning. After golfing, I drove the TR3B around the resort and did my version of a hill climb to the top of Massanutten Mountain. I got a really cool video of the spirited drive, as I was pushing the "3" pretty hard through the switch back turns ... and the car ran GREAT! Upon our return, we enjoyed the water park inside the resort.

On Wednesday, June 12th our adventure continued with a trip on Skyline Drive.



Our destination was Cooter's for lunch. Dukes of Hazzard fans may know this place. Sadly, the restaurant was closed; however, we did visit the museum.



We decided to go to the town of New Market for lunch, with a visit to Luray Caverns on the way.

After lunch we headed back to our resort via a drive through Harrisonburg, VA. My daughter followed behind videotaping a lot of the action. We did 155 miles today and the car ran GREAT!

On Thursday, June 13th we hung around the resort and I got in another 18 holes of golf. That evening we traveled to Harrisonburg for an ice cream run. This was my first time driving this car at night. Needless to say, the car ran GREAT!

On Friday, June 14th we had planned to attend a car show in Harrisonburg; but it rained off and on, so no TR3 adventures that day. We hung out at the resort and packed up to leave on Saturday.

Ever need to thread a nut onto a bolt in an unreachable location? In olden days, a piece of Double Bubble would do the trick to hold a nut in a wrench to reach into an inaccessible area.



I found a great substitute for bubble gum - Super Glue Handi-Tak. It's used to temporarily stick papers on walls and refrigerators; but it works great to keep a nut in an open end wrench. Put a small chunk in the corner of an open end wrench and jam the nut into it.

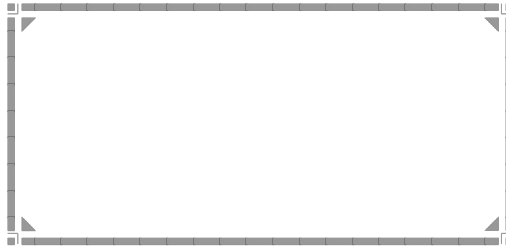
