Tina Krivenko stepped up to call out the winning numbers and her capable staff of helpers was at the ready to deliver the auction items to the lucky winners.



A Tribute to Stan Carpenter ~ By Denny Ward

For four years or so, Stan Carpenter had penned his Tire Trax column for *The Vintage Jaguar*, usually illustrated by his own photography. I thought that a final Tire Trax would be a good way to say farewell to Stan. This piece will be much more random than Stan's work ever was as he would often re-write a column once or twice before being satisfied with the result.

First, Stan's words, from his August 2020 column about the history of the Meeting of the Marques: "It was July 18, 1990 when 'Tiger Tom' Ehrhart and Jared Worman called fellow British car club leaders together to talk about creating a Central PA car show to be held the next summer. Triumph, Sunbeam, Austin Healy, Morris Minor & MG clubs and the Appalachian Sports Car Club were represented, although the show wouldn't be under the banner of any one club. On Dec. 21, 1990 the executive board voted in favor of Allenberry as the venue wth the inaugural all-British car show to be held on Sept. 29, 1991. It's reported that 255 motorcars participated that first year with the 1948 Jaguar Mk IV Drophead of Donald Buxton Jr. claiming Best of Show honors. Harold Zabady and wife Barbara were involved from its infancy,

his artwork gracing MoM posters and literature over the years, including my last year as Chairman in 2018. Jerry Dubiansky imparted great counsel to me for a number of years as treasurer, making sure we stayed inside the green lines."

"It was during 2007-2008 timeframe that I approached the SVVSCC's Board of Directors with the idea of expanding The MoM to 1) be more inclusive for the multi -marque club that we were and 2) take it out of its private-show setting to a public venue that could actively promote our hobby. Yes, if you were mad about leaving Allenberry – that was me. In this time when perpetuating interest in many of our classics is nearly non-existent outside of the 'Boomer generation, my cornerstone objective of public exposure is more important than ever. For the sake of these wonderful vehicles, it's not a time to be stagnant on the sidelines."

"In September 2011, Angie and I were attending Carlisle's Harvest of the Arts street festival. Sitting there completely empty yet blocked off, because the festival hadn't grown that far, was one of the most picturesque blocks in all of Carlisle – West High Street, in the shadows of Dickinson College and their mighty oaks. That 'instant' spoke to me and I told her that this is where The Meeting of the Marques had to be! My 2011 vision became reality in 2015 as we occupied West High Street for the very first time, and have ever since.

I'm most proud of developing the Student Judges program with Carlisle Area High School Auto Tech teacher David Appleman, by involving his students to one day inherit our hobby."

Again, Stan's words: "[In 2000] when the Susquehanna Valley Vintage Sports Car Club was founded, Tiger Tom [Ehrhart] used his position on the SVVSCC's founding Exec Board to ask that this 'real car club' take over The MoM. As an aside, within its first year of club operations, the SVVSCC would inherit not just this popular British car show; but be asked by HERCO CEO Scott Newkum to create and stage the Hershey Vintage Hillclimb."

Stan was a great fan of the vintage racing at the Pittsburgh Grand Prix. In 2021 Stan wrote that "as a starting point, celebrating its 39th year with nearly \$6 million raised for their two charity partners, the 10-day 'Race Week' is America's premier vintage racing event, culminating on the streets of a city park - Schenley Park to be exact. It takes over 1,000 volunteers to ensure that an estimated 250,000 spectators leave Pittsburgh's Race Week with the desire to return the following year. The downside of British Car Day, if you want to call it a downside, is that the nearly non-stop spectator interest [in the Silver Bullet] kept me from experiencing other areas of the venue, including race group practices and qualifying."

Another of Stan's favorite events is the Vintage Races at Watkins Glen, and he wrote often about this event. "While I didn't take notice of any new Jaguars on track this year [2019], I did find a few new 'favorite' camera locations. And even though you may recognize their liveries from the past, is it really possible to grow tired of looking at these beautiful machines? No, I didn't think so!"

In 2021 Stan attended the Carlisle Import Show, as he did almost every year for as long as I can remember. "I saw several SVJC members/Jaguar friends over the weekend, and my apologies in advance for those I fail to mention...nothing meant by it. Denny Ward spent both days exercising his camera as the visual record for The Valley Jaguar. Earl Mowrey stopped by for a chat on Saturday, sharing insight on some writing projects he has in the works. Harold Zabady stopped by the CPTC [Central PA Triumph Club - ed.] tent, his 'hemi' E-type recently broken free from the confines of its AACA Museum display, and Tom Buckus out on Vendor Row 'C' with his Jaguar tool kits."

We will wrap up this special <u>Tire Trax</u> with some random photos that epitomize Stan's enthusiasm for and dedication to our hobby.
